ince its inception in 1996, the Phoenix

Sister Cities Disability Awareness Committee (PSC/DAC) has been working towards improving disability awareness in the city of Phoenix and its member Sister Cities.

By developing a variety of inter-community programs incorporating those individuals with disabilities into already existing programs, or creation of new ones, PSC/DAC has been nationally recognized as a leader in the disability arena. Having won the Disability Advocacy Award seven times in twelve years, the International Competition of Artists with Disabilities is the first competition to showcase both international and local artists with disabilities.

PSC/DAC is excited to offer recognition to those artists who have reached beyond their disability and utilized their creative talents to promote a global understanding of disabilities. The international and local art submitted for the competition will be displayed in Phoenix, as well as in an online gallery, which will highlight each artist with their biography and accompanying picture.

THEME: Talent Has No Boundaries

EXHIBITION No prize money, but certificates for 1st 2nd, and 3rd place will be presented; \$15 entries. Participants are responsible for picking up their artwork or covering cost of packaging and mailing.

COMPETITION Compete for prize money for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. No entry fee, but 1st piece donated to Disability Awareness Committee (DAC). If multiple entries, specify which is for donation; otherwise DAC will choose donated piece. Any additional pieces sold, split proceeds 50/50 between artist and DAC.

CONTEST RULES & INFORMATION

WHO CAN ENTER Persons 19 years of age and older with a disability residing in the state of Arizona or one of Phoenix's ten sister cities: Calgary, Canada; Catania, Italy; Chengdu, China; Ennis, Ireland; Grenoble, France; Hermosillo, Mexico; Himeji, Japan; Prague, Czech Republic; Ramat-Gan, Israel; and Taipei, Taiwan.

JUDGING A panel of judges will evaluate entries based on theme interpretation.

PRIZES \$500 first place, \$300 second place, and \$150 third place, (donated pieces only) \$500 People's Choice, \$300 Best Local Artist, \$300 Best Photograph. A certificate of participation will be given to all entrants.
